
<u>A Message From Our President</u>

All Roads Lead to Baltimore... By Way of Chicago!



On December 1, 2018, Brother Dr. Willis L. Lonzer, III was announced as one of six Brothers vying for the position of General President of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. Always among Ebony Magazine's 100 Most Influential, General Presidents of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. have the honor of leading the world's best and brightest college educated men.

As the sitting Midwestern Regional Vice President, with a track record of positive brotherhood engagement and progressive advancement of the Region; and with the support of his own chapter, Xi Lambda, Bro. Lonzer felt he was best positioned to lead Alpha Phi Alpha in current times. His platform: Elevating the Alpha Spirit. A simple phrase, with dynamic intent. Bro. Lonzer's vision is to: strengthen the Brotherhood, improve operational excellence of the fraternity, and increase servant leadership.

After nearly two years of campaigning, traveling, engaging Brothers (both in person and virtually), and time away from his family, Bro. Lonzer was called to Baltimore, Maryland to be present when the ballots were counted. While in Baltimore, he would learn if he had in fact connected with the Brothers well enough to have won their hearts and votes.

On July 24, 2020, the results came in, and Bro. Lonzer was confirmed as the winner and General President-Elect! On January 1, 2021, Bro. Dr. Willis Lonzer, III, a native of Richmond, VA, but a current resident of the South Side of Chicago, will become the 36th General President of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc.

Brother Lonzer will be the 3rd General President to have had membership in Xi Lambda Chapter, but the first to be a member while holding the position. The next best thing to having the General Headquarters in Chicago, is to have the General President. He could not have won without the support of all Chicagoland Alphas, but specifically, the Brothers of Xi Lambda!

We've Been Here Before

With the myriad issues we have seen in 2020, "we are in unprecedented times" has become a popular refrain. While that statement speaks to the fact that our fraternity, our country, and our entire world was unprepared for this "new reality," historically speaking, it is neither new nor unique.

Between 1917 and 1919, Alpha Phi Alpha dealt with issues very similar to those with which we are dealing now, in addition to a war.

In 1917, the United States entered "the war to end all wars," which we now refer as World War I. Brothers enlisted in the Army, where Alpha men were the largest representation of any black fraternity at the Fort Des Moines training camp in Iowa. Brothers from Illinois, whether initiated here or who lived here, would join the medical corps, serving as physicians and dentists, treating the casualties of war.

In May 1917, between 1,000 to 3,000 white men attacked African Americans in East St. Louis, Illinois. This stemmed, in part, due to a strike at the Aluminum Ore Company, where blacks were hired to replace the striking workers and there was unrest regarding the mere presence of blacks in East St. Louis. As many as 250 blacks were killed in the riots that lasted almost 2 months.

In 1918, the H1N1 influenza A virus, became a worldwide pandemic. Estimates suggest as many as 50 million people died from the virus between 1918 and 1921. Then, as now, citizens were encouraged to wear protective masks, practice social distancing, and improve sanitary conditions

- which compared to today's standards, were significantly less stringent. Editions of *The Sphinx* from 1919 and 1920 all make mention of our brothers who were felled by the virus, both during and after the war.

Then in the summer of 1919, often referred to as "The Red Summer," Chicago, like several other cities around the country, erupted in a race riot. This riot was caused by the death of a young black teenager who was swimming on the wrong side of 31st Street by Lake Michigan in Chicago. The riot lasted over a week, resulting in the deaths of over 30 African Americans, with hundreds more injured. Alpha men during that time played a key role in uniting the community to provide protection and security for the residents in and around what is now known as the Bronzeville neighborhood.

War, racial violence, pandemic. Over 100 years ago, our fraternity, less than 20 years after its founding, faced several significant hurdles that would have (and did) decimated other organizations. Add to the fact that within 10 years, it would face another significant issue with the Great (Continued next page)

Depression of 1929, but Alpha held steadfast to its aims and goals.

Alpha Phi Alpha not only continued but grew and thrived despite the obstacles that the fraternity faced.

The fraternity still initiated members and chartered chapters. Alpha developed and promoted "Go to High School, Go to College" and "A Voteless People is a Hopeless People," among other community-based programs, that continue to make an impact in cities around the country. Alpha men started and grew businesses while beginning to shatter racial barriers imposed by the medical, legal, and business industries.

Brothers organized themselves and the communities all without television, regular telephone usage, and most certainly without the internet and social media. Yet, only shortly after the end of the war, Alpha chapters in Illinois and throughout the country would create and promote educational and social programs designed to uplift our communities and provide an example of how Black men were indeed capable, willing, and able to move the race forward.

More than 100 years later, Alpha is still a pivotal force in our communities. The chapters in Illinois continue to move onward and upward, participating in and leading marches for social justice, providing materials to combat COVID-19, sponsoring voter education, mentorship, and any number of other social and community programs. Because even a century later, Alpha Phi Alpha is still the light of the world.

Brothers, we did it before, and we can do it again! Over a century ago, our Brothers accomplished so much with so little. With all the resources we have available to us today, there is no reason we cannot replicate and improve upon what was done before.

History teaches us that Alpha has met every hurdle encountered and grew stronger. Now is the time to uphold the ideals of the Jewels and our early members, remembering what they accomplished and use that as an inspiration as we move forward.

We are First of All, Alpha Men!!

We are Servants of All and will continue to serve our communities as Alpha Men should.

We Shall Transcend All because we are ALPHA PHI ALPHA! We have done it before, and we will do it again.


